Patterson

About 20 different naturals in this area. All north-facing and mostly D2, with one producing D3 debris about a mile long.

Red Devil

Near "Old Cutters" 6 - D1.5-2 avalanches released near the tail end of the storm on an NW at ~6900'. There appear to be game tracks entering one of the crowns, which could be the trigger. <u>Johnstone Peak</u> 1 - D3 natural on a W at ~9600'

18 - Snowplow/Rotary Blower triggered slides from D1.5-2 with 1-2' crowns (except on the north side of the pass 2-3' crown)

1 - D2 wide propagation near Galena Summit, where there was a snowboarder fatality over 20 years ago?
